Today, as the sun rose on Anzac Day at Tailem Bend Memorial for 2024 Service people, family, friends and loved ones came together to honour our dedicated servicemen and servicewoman.

Sue Morgan, Master of Ceremonies started the proceeding by introducing Tyler Wilson who acknowledged our custodians of the land and everyone who attended. Savannah Downs & Tylar Fix from Tailem Bend Primary School, Year 6 read the names of the 21 servicemen and 1 nurse, all were dedicated WW1 local heroes. Their names on the crosses surrounding the memorial with a lit candle.

A very moving Gallipoli Recital was played to the silence crowd, as all audience listen to the recording. Followed by the reading of The Lord's Prayer by Pastor Timothy Minahan from Revival City Church. Ceara Goodwin then read the Anzac Poem – In Flanders Fields by John McCrae.


Pangarinda Botanic Garden Visitors Delight

Puzzling Dunny Dilemma

Long term resident, David Neihus of Tailem Bend, is looking for answers to his ongoing local main street disability toileting dilemma. David is aware of the length of time it took Tailem Bend to receive its long overdue improved Toilet Block, but he continues to be puzzled by how he can use them, without asking for help.

"Luckly, I have a Support Worker with me on most occasions when I am out and about, but on those occasions when I am on my own, I have to resort to bush toileting with my bottle," David said. "I really don't like answering strangers to help me out, and even when I have a Support Worker, I regularly find the Disability Unisex toilet being used by someone in a rush." David believes that one of the solutions to getting into the disability cubical would be to make all the Tailem Bend toilets Unisex, allowing anyone to use any of the cubicles. "I've seen ladies lining up to the car park waiting for a female toilet to be free," he said.

David, known as Tailem's Resident Pirate, has Cerebral Palsy and has been using his mobility scooter since 2017 to get around Meningie, Goolwa, Murray Bridge Shopping Centres, and his hometown of Tailem Bend. He only has the limited use of one hand and arm, and has found difficulties everywhere, except in Adelaide CBD. "I do get around a bit and my toilet accessibility issues are everywhere - we could also definitely do with more footpaths in Tailem - Meningie has footpaths everywhere and they're real flash," he says.

"But with the toilets, I understand it must be a financial issue to fit automatic doors everywhere, but surely a simple bush engineering approach could fix this issue. A sliding door or even a 180-degree shearing shed type swinging door into a large open toilet cubical, would work," David Said.

"The doors in Tailem's main street toilets, are very heavy and stiff, and I can't open them wide enough in one attempt, even if I move backwards and forwards to open the doors wider, they don't lock in place long enough for me to manoeuvre my mobility scooter inside – then, even if I do get into the cubicle, there isn't enough room for me to get close enough to transfer to the toilet pan."

Born in Naracoorte, David's father was a painter with South Australian Railways (SAR) and moved his family to Tailem Bend when David was a young child. David currently lives with his sister in Tailem Bend and is hoping to receive fulltime NDIS support, so he can live independently into the future. David's Support Agency has formally approached the Coorong District Council, and he understands that the council is investigating the issue. David only uses the Tailem Bend main street toilets, when he has support and only then for privacy, to fill and empty his urine bottle.

This Month we look at Foot Ball Club, Rhonda & Dave Mik, and Music Hall...

Guernsey Presentation, 1990.

About 40 players gathered to present jumpers to this season's senior squad. Many had travelled from Adelaide for the night and Pat Connolly attended, while on holidays from Sydney.

Jack Jaensch was the oldest past player present at the dinner, with a career that began in in 1927. World War 11 ended his playing days and that of his brother, and 1937 Mail Medallist Bernie Jaensch. Tailem was then known as the Warriors, but changed its name to the more familiar Eagles in the early 40s. Dick Searle was captain of the 1947 undefeated team which also included Pat Connolly, eldest of the eight Connolly brothers who played for the Eagles. Another guest on the night was the legendary ruckman Bill Lokan who presented his famous No 26 jumper to current ruckman Mike Hunt. Bill Lokan won Mail Medals in 1958 when playing with Tailem and 1959 with Jervois. Known for his skill and big heart, Bill Lokan said Jervois Lyall Kelly and Imperial's Les stone were his toughest opponents.

Tailem Troupers excel themselves.

Bright Singing, good humour and striking colourful costumes marked Tailem Bend Music Hall's 13th annual production. As delightful as the previous 12 productions have been, this year's was probably closer to a true Music Hall than its predecessors.

Songs were presented in a well – defined segments and although the humorous sections began a little slowly (at least on Friday night,) those presenting, soon got into their stride. The short musical play, The Gypsies' Reward, staged after the opening number was a bold attempt at something different. While each member of the cast gave of their all, they showed mainly by their performance later in the evening that they are better suited to singing and comedy. So humorous were some of the comedy routines that I thought some people, sitting near would do themselves an injury from the way they reacted. There are scene stealers and show stoppers in any production and this years was no exception.

Little Narelle Scott, only four years old, should have won everyone's heart for her obvious enthusiasm and plain "cuteness." How Peter Phillips managed to remain poker faced and unmoved as half a dozen ungainly men dressed as women flappers of the 1920s danced and cavorted around him in Hey Big Spender will remain one of life's little mysteries. And while most of the female members sang well was particularly impressed with the standard of Helen Read and Karen Kneebone.

The irrepressible John Schwerdt despite being laid low with a virus earlier in the week, also had the audience in stitches with a couple of his routines. And it will be a sad day for the production if ever it losses the two cleaning women, played by Joyce Medlow and Lynn Simcock and their comedy routines. Backstage work, scenery and lighting were all handled well and the way was handled seemed to be an improvement on last year, in that most performers could be easily understood. I felt that show could have been a bit shorter. The only suggestion assuming the production goes into a 14th year is to try and condense it a little. This will only reduce the load a bit on cast members, but leave the audience wanting more the sure sign of a successful show.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #140

Bakers Retiring, 1984.

Tailem Bend – This typical working day scene will soon be a thing of the past for well-known local bakers Dave and Rhonda Mik. They bake very little bread these days (mainly rolls,) concentrating instead on pies, pasties, and cakes.

In the late fifties, however, the bakery churned out 3000 or more loaves a day. Six people were employed – four baking one packing and one delivering. "We used to pack bread in tea chests. And send it by rail to farmers along the line to Keith, Coonalpyn and Karoonda," Rhonda said, and by mail truck to Meningie and Narrung. It was quite common to send six loaves to one family three times a week. People used to eat a lot more bread in those days, than now.

Dave believes the decline in bread consumption is due to the greater variety of food available including the convenience of take away. "Pies and pasties have become more popular during the years, so what we lost in one way, we made up in another," he said "we get our bread from Adelaide, now. When the big Adelaide bakeries started coming in the country, it was a case of joining them or getting out because we couldn't compete."


The old high loaf is almost non-existent now, although the Miks still bake a couple every week for one customer. Rhonda said the Hightop was a fluffier bread, because it rise above the tin, whereas the sandwich loaf was restricted – once it reached the limits of the tin, "that was it," Bread stays fresher longer these days, according to Dave, because of better ingredients and modern mixing machines. "Years ago, we used to bake Thursday afternoons and send the bread Friday mornings – people just wouldn't accept that these days"

Dave, when younger, used to play football on Saturday afternoons, and soccer on Sunday, then go to the bakery and make dough Sunday nights, and get up about 4am Mondays to start baking. At their busiest they would prepare for weekend production by starting at 4am Thursdays, finishing about 10 or 11am. Three hours later, they would begin another batch, working until 5am or 6pm, then bake again on Fridays.

Dave is still well known in football circles in the Lower Murray, he was Tailem Bend Football Club President for four years, and now is serving his second term as River Murray League President. Rhonda says she will retire when the new owners take over on February. Dave said he will go into semi—retirement, but doesn't know what he'll do to keep occupied. "Well stay in Tailem Bend. The town, and the people, have been good to us, and we like it here" they said.

Tailem Bend's Cemetery, thanks to the town's dedicated volunteers and the Coorong Council, is poised for ANZAC day with their Diggers Retreat memorial being enriched, to honour those veterans resting in Tailem Bend Cemetery.

Anzac Day means a great deal to communities throughout Australia - at the end of 1915, allied forces were evacuated from the Gallipoli Peninsula with both sides suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships – resulting in over 8,000 Australian soldiers being killed. Today the meaning of Anzac Day includes the remembrance of all Australians killed in military operations.

Pauline Merritt of Tailem Bend, one of the town's dedicated volunteers, is extremely proud of the Tailem Bend Cemetery and understands the importance of honouring ANZAC Day and all serving personnel.

"They're an exceptional group of people, who have given so much for the freedom we all share today - that is why we have made an effort at our Cemetery to remember them all," Pauline said. "Our Cemetery wasn't always as nice and respectable as it is today - we've work very hard over the last 23 years and we're all extremely proud of our recent addition to our Diggers Retreat memorial."

Pauline would like to thank the Coorong District Council, as she feels that the volunteers have had a fairly free run at renovating the cemetery – they commenced work at the cemetery in early 2003.

Tailem's Primary School - Leading the Way

Congratulations to the staff and students at Tailem Bend Primary School. The school is now the most Google Certified Primary School in Australia – and has also been selected as a Google for Education, Reference School.

As reported in Murray Bridge News on Thursday, June 8, 2023, years from now, when employers are hiring for the jobs of the future, many ex-Tailem Bend Primary School students will find themselves at the top of the list. Back in 2023, Tailem Bend was the only school in South Australia which integrated technology into every part of its school curriculum - being just the second in the nation, to be selected for the \$500,000 program.

Guests at the School Assembly on Friday, April 12, 2024, Darren Macolino of Google for Education, Adelaide, and Claire Furlong, one of the creators of the Datacom Beacon School Project, awarded numerous Google for Education wards to both students and teachers. "It's a true privilege to be here today to attest to the development of 21st-century skills, all credit must go to the students and their teachers for their outstanding outcomes – and a special shoutout to the team at Datacom for creating the Beacon School Project, without them none of this would be possible," Darren Macolino said. "Google for Education is delighted by the progress of the Tailem Bend Primary School."

School Principal Travis Schenke's 2023 forecast that the school's Beacon School Project would be a true gamechanger for next-generational learning environments for teachers and students, has come to fruition. "The students and their teachers have discovered so much and in such a short time – and the integration of technology into their lessons, has been wonderful to witness," Travis said. "It has helped activate their creativity, deepen their understanding of the world, and powered their ambitions for the future."

Every student in the school was provided with a Chrome-book computer, and over the months, benefited from excursions and visits from experts, while staff continued their professional development with collaboration opportunities from educators around the world. The school's students have been part of a world-first study with Curtin University in Western Australia, which has been measuring their growing ability to collaborate, communicate, create, think critically, develop digital literacy, innovate, learn, organise, and solve problems.

Do You See What I See?

We have all had the experience of looking for something and not being able to find it. Car keys are usually high on the list. We look and look but to no avail. Then someone comes to help and they find them right where we were looking. Or we look again for the hundredth time in the same spot and there they are.

Welcome to this month's **Council update**

Over the past month Council has been busy undertaking a range of activities, attending events and delivering programs across the district.

Around the District

Council's Roads & Infrastructure team are consistently busy with the delivery of a range of key projects and operational services to the community.

Rural road users are continuing to be supported through the patrol grading program, with 118.5kms of unsealed roads graded during March 2024.

The Sealed Roads Renewal **Program** is focusing on works at across the district with resealing / reconstruction on sealed roads occurring at the following locations:

- Kulde Road Naturi, At train crossing
- Tauragat Well Road Coonalpyn, 800 metres north east of Pascoe Rd intersection
- Tynan Road Sherlock, Various segments
- Pettet Road Meningie, Warrengie Drive to Narrung Road
- Lime Kiln Road Tailem Bend, Between Magpie Drive and Sheoak Place

- Kulkawurra Road (Stage 1) Sherlock, Worden Road heading south west
- Warrengie Drive Meningie, Cul-de-sac at east end of street

To stay updated on the current sealed roads renewal program, please visit Council's website.

The Unsealed Roads Program will also see re-sheeting of 6.5kms on Riddell Road and 6kms on Yumali Road during April. Road users are reminded to take caution whilst roadworks are underway.

Little Corella management activities currently include use of portable gas guns on Council land in Tailem Bend. Staff have been undertaking bird scaring activities following considerable damage to trees, parks and playing fields.

The Community Facilities teams have also been busy clearing foliage debris created by Little Corellas and ensuring that community spaces remain tidy.

Wellington East Cemetery Interpretive signage has been installed at the cemetery thanks to historical research undertaken by the Tailem Bend Historians Association and a collaborative project between Council. The signage installed in the shelter contains the history of the




The Pit


