Blue Tree Planted

The community marked a significant milestone on Friday, August 22, 2024, as Tailem Bend Primary School kicked off the community's Blue Tree Project, a mental health initiative that has gained national recognition for its impact on raising awareness about depression and suicide.

The day began with a special assembly, attended by students, teachers, parents, and local community members. Primary School Principal, Travis Schenke, addressed the assembly with a message that resonated deeply, with many of those present. "Our community has, in recent years, been deeply touched by depression and suicide," he explained. He reassured the children, emphasizing the importance of talking openly about their feelings.

"Please feel free to talk openly, our community is a truly caring community and there are lots of opportunities to have a chat and ask for help if you're feeling a little down," Travis said, encouraging an atmosphere of openness and support.

The Blue Tree Project, which has grown into a well-established charity, aims to change the way communities talk about mental health issues. Its origins lie in a simple yet powerful act – that of painting a dead tree, blue, to spark conversations about mental health. In Tailem Bend, the project has taken on even greater significance following the tragic loss of several community members over the past eight or so years. The school's newly installed Blue Tree, prominently positioned near the School's Assembly Hall, serves as a visible reminder to everyone.

Leshenaultia Biloba has been described as one of the world's most heavenly flowers due to its sky-blue colour.

Splashes of blue are appearing in different parts of Pangarinda Botanic Garden as this small ground-hugging shrub is covered in delicate sky-blue flowers. Loves full sunshine and Pangarinda Botanic Gardens' slightly acid sandy soil. It is well known in Western Australia where it is found growing over a wide area. The 26 known genera of Leshenaultia are all endemic to Australia with L filiformis the only Species that extends into New Guinea. A difficult plant to keep growing in cultivation.

The prostrate Banksias growing at Pangarinda Botanic Garden often surprise visitors. One is Banksia blechnifolia. Flowers are borne on the ends of ground-hugging branches, forming a circle of erect rusty red flowers amongst new soft bronze leaves.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #145

It is a long-running series, submitted by Peter Connolly.

Memories of Jack, Viola Jaensch and upgrade of the Hospital...

Depression memories linger for a couple married 60 years.

Memories of the Great Depression, in the thirties, linger strongest in the minds of couple Jack and Viv (Viola) Jaensch, who celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary.

The depression started about two years before they were married, by Pastor Gerry Obst in Tailem Bend Lutheran Church on April 19, 1932. It had, they say, reached its depth about the time they married. Living on their property, at Moorlands, made life a little better, but they had to live what they could get from selling milk and eggs- their sole source of income. Many farmers were forced off the land because of low wheat prices, often well below the cost of production. *"They talk about farmers being forced off their land today. But it happened more often then,"* Mr Jaensch said.

About two years after they married **'swaggies'** started calling in unemployed men who walked around the country with just a swag, looking for work."*The poor beggars who offer to cut wood or do almost anything for a meal or two,*" Mr Jaensch said.

The couple could not give the swaggies much. Groceries, including bread, came out only once a week by train from Tailem Bend, and if the couple gave away much, they didn't have enough for themselves. There was no made road from Tailem Bend to Moorlands, and the only transport they had was the family truck. They lived on a property adjoining that owned by **Mr Jaensch's father.** A trip (**by truck**) into Tailem Bend about once a month was a treat. *"We survived. We just didn't buy things, not even for the home,"* Mrs Jaensch said. *"We just lived, that's all. You didn't buy anything you could do without."*

Mr Jaensch said it took him three years to use up a 25-form chequebook. He said **World War 11 (1939-1945)** brought the end of the Depression, but what people couldn't afford during the Depression, they couldn't' buy during the war because many items were rationed petrol, clothes, some foodstuffs and he thinks, some building materials.

"It was only after the war we got on our feet," he said. In 1934, Mr Jaensch was appointed grain agent in Moorlands and said this was the hardest physical time of his life. *"I wouldn't have weighed more than 10 stone (67 kg) but I had to lump wheat bags weighing about 200lbs (90 kg)* he said. Although he says this work helped the couple through the Depression, he blames his present slight curvature of his back to the physical demands.

After the war when grain prices had risen, Mr Jaensch and his two sons **(Brian and Bevan)** began to grow cereal crops. Mr Jaensch was a councillor for his ward, on Peake District Council for 18 years, and a Justice of the Peace for 40 years. The couple retired from the farm and moved to Murray Bridge, where they have been living in Monarto Heights Retirement Village, where they were among the first six couples to move in. The couple has six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. A celebration has been planned by their sons and their wives in the Tailem Bend Lutheran Church.

Hospital Completes \$250,000 Upgrade, 1991.

The Lower Murray District Hospital, at Tailem Bend, recently completed a \$250,000 building and renovation program, funded by the South Australian Health Commission and the Hospital Board. This follows an agreement between the Health Commission and the Hospital board, regarding the hospital's continuing role in caring for acute cases.

The hospital's ability to respond to major road trauma and other emergencies has been markedly improved by these renovations. The new emergency reception area utilizes the theatre for the management of severe injuries, and the original labour ward, sterilizing area and theatre annex have been incorporated into an open-plan area.

This provides for efficient care and observation of multiple casualties and optimises day-to-day outpatient activities. Adjacent is an attractive outpatient waiting area and consulting room. The North wing of the hospital has been completely renovated, for the care of patients with acute illness. Most of the rooms have superb views over the River Murray and provide single or twin accommodation with en-suite bathrooms. The new nursing station has been designed to optimize efficient patient care. It incorporates a high-dependency observation area and easy access to the patient record filing room. Other changes have included renovation of the administration areas. Soft furnishings and a tasteful décor, provided by the Friends of the Hospital, have enhanced the renovations. In addition to in-patient and out-patient services, the hospital's outreach nursing team has been increasingly active in caring for the community's aged and disabled in their own homes. The lack of public transport in the town results in considerable difficulty for many people. The hospital's bus is used extensively to help people access community activities, health appointments, shopping, and hospital Day Care activities. The hospital's Medical Centre, which has been functioning since 1989, now provides the services of three general practitioners (Dr Patrick O'Neil, Robert Entwistle, and Kathryn Materne), a visiting paediatrician, (Prof Garry Kneebone), and a dentist (Dr Graham Parry) and dental Hygienist.

Also, an orthodontist physiotherapist, therapeutic masseuse, podiatry, optometrist, audiologist and speech therapist visit regularly. The community has enhanced access to the regional services and the facilities at the Murray Bridge Hospital. This has enhanced the continuity of care of patients by their doctor for surgical procedures and obstetrics, then transfer to Tailem Bend Hospital for post-operative care. "The hospital is grateful for the support and co-operation of the Murray Bridge Hospital and Murray Bridge Clinic." Director of Nursing Mrs Bette LeCornu said. The hospital now plans to landscape the grounds and renovate the kitchen and the south wing. Chairman of the Board Mr Neville Jaensch says the continuing community support through fundraising and other activities, such as volunteer driving, is vital to the hospital's future.

50th Roll Racing Event at The Bend



Tailem Bend Street Party is back!

The Coorong District Council, Tailem Bend Auto Club and Shell V-Power Motorsport Park will once again combine to put on the now traditional Spring Nationals Tailem Bend Street Party on Friday, 18th October.

Following on from the immense success in 2023, the second coming will see the event grow further with thousands from the local community and visitors to the region expected to attend the event and descend on the town's main street between 4:30 - 8pm.

The event will feature live music, huge car displays supported by

the local car clubs, a large variety of food and drink outlets, and a presence from the competing National Drag Racing Championship categories. The hive of activity is the perfect way to mark day one of the second annual Spring Nationals with the Sportsman racing component to get underway on the morning of Friday, 18th October.

Around the District

Throughout the past month Coorong District Council has undertaken a range of activities, attended events and delivered programs across the district.

The **Community Facilities** team have been focussing on trimming trees and vegetation across the district. The team have also installed a new flying fox at Tintinara, undertaken weed spraying on the centre median strip of the Princes Highway in Tailem Bend, installed a new sign at the Meningie Bird Hide while maintaining community facilities across the district (including graffiti removal and disposing of tyres that were illegally dumped at Sherlock).

The **2024/25 Unsealed Roads Program** is underway, with 2.5km of the re-sheet complete on Richardson Road, Culburra. Preparation works began for resheeting works on Malinong Road, Malinong and Heinrich Road, Coonalpyn in September.

Rural road users are continuing be supported to through Council's grading patrol program. Residents can expect to see the Meningie grader in the Field Road area, the Coonalpyn grader near Richardson and Todd roads and the Tailem Bend grader will be based at the Hannah Well Road and Dukes Highway area in the coming weeks.

Works to see the 7km section of **Carcuma Road sealed** between the Thomas Foods Feedlot and Southern Cross Road commenced mid-September and are expected to take 3 months.





Willochra, Railway Commissioners Carriage

With reference to, The Changing Face of Tailem Bend, issue 144, Tailem Topics September 2024.

When the Willochra, Railway Commissioner's Carriage was condemned and subsequently put up for tender by the S.A. Railways, Mrs Jessie Nicholls of Jabuk, saw the tender notice while checking the Advertiser for the handicap on the mare she had entered for the Easter Racing Carnival at Oakbank. I don't recall the handicap odds, but I do recall her placing \$100 on the Tender. She won it on the 23-06-1966.

There was a need for sleeping quarters, brought about by a scarcity of local shearers, who would return home at end of day's work. Outsourced shearers meant a lot of work with in house preparation and general disruption. Jessie was still recovering from a serious car accident in 1961 that left her partially paralysed. I recall the transport of Willochra to the farm was done by Lokan Transport of Tailem Bend, with the lift from the semitrailer and site placement completed by Regnier Cranes from Murray Bridge.

With four roomy bunks at one end, the middle was dining, kitchen and bathroom with stainless steel and brass fittings, all in excellent condition. The far end had a leather clad lounge with a 'Grande' array of brass overhead luggage racks, brass electric fans and ornate fluted pink glass lighting, with general fittings of brass. However, the first signs of water staining were evident. The decision was made to retain and preserve the interior at all cost. The 24volt electrical system was retained by putting in a 240v transformer. Eventually the rooftop was clad with Malthoid to secure the water problem. Willochra then served its purpose for 16 years.

In 1982 the decision was made to move it on. Peter Squires was a regular visitor to the farm, as R.F. Nicholls had been a valued client of Heynen Motors, Peter's business base for many years.

With Old Tailem Town developing, Peter expressed his interest in Willochra. It all fell into place. Aware that some expense would be incurred in the relocation process, Willochra was offered to Peter, of Old Tailem Town, Free, on Site, on Farm in 1982 by the son of R.F. Nicholls, Craigh, who owned the farm and was custodian of Willochra at the time.

When visiting the Port Dock Museum in c2002, to see the restoration work, we were devastated to see it had been gutted back to a skeleton frame work. Enquiries to the museum, revealed restoration had been postponed. Where the Railway Commissioner's Carriage is, or its condition, is unknown.


