A Tailem Bend woman's dedication to her community has earned her recognition as one of the Coorong district's citizens of the year.

Raelene Varga was named one of two award recipients at Tailem Bend's Australia Day event on Sunday 25th of Januray. She was recognised for her multiple volunteer roles within the community, including with the Tailem Topics, Tailem Bend Football Club, the Friends of the Tailem Bend Hospital and the former Tailem Bend Music Hall. Perhaps where she spends most of her time, though, is as the Tailem Bend RSL's bar manager. RSL president Chris Taylor said Ms Varga was the kind of person who did something because she wanted to, not because she had been asked.

"Her unwavering love for Tailem Bend is evident on the daily ... if you ever wondered who keeps the town tidy, picking up rubbish as she come across it, it's Raelene," Mr Taylor said.

Ms Varga said she was deeply honoured to receive the citizen of the year title for 2025. "Volunteering ... allows me to serve people with a warm welcome and friendly conversation," she said. She mostly enjoys assisting in the monthly karaoke sessions held by the RSL, and possibly singing the odd song here and there. "I would also like to acknowledge the other volunteers as we all have our own special jobs, we are a good team," she said.

Judy Bagg, who accepted the award on behalf of the community centre, said the Enchanted Experience was a true reflection of the heart and soul of the community. "*It was designed to create an escape, a sense of wonder and moments of social connection,*" she said. The success of the Enchanted event inspired the team to create another display last year, this time Inside-out themed.

"This display highlighted the importance of emotional intelligence and fostering genuine connections during the festive season, reminding us all of the beauty in our shared humanity," Ms Bagg said. She thank everyone who visited the experience, the volunteers for making it happen and those who embraced the magic.

Murray Bridge News welcomed a new journalist, Liana Webster, thanks to a grant from the Walkley Foundation; we moved to a new web platform; and we published more than 750 stories –we'll look back at the best of them in the coming days. I haven't told you this yet, but we recently earned accreditation as a social enterprise, too, recognising that this for-profit business has a community focus. On a personal note, I've been pleased to learn a few things at industry events in Port Douglas and Sydney, and to be re-elected to the board of the Local and Independent News Association.

This Month we look at the memories of Neville Gotch and the School Gym.

Neville Farewells 21-Year Routine

It will take a trek across the Simpson Desert to help Tailem Bend primary School's principal ease into retirement, breaking a 21-year-old routine is not something you do every day.

"I have no doubts I am going to miss it—and in particular the Kids" said Neville. Neville Gotch will take many memories with him when he steps down from his position of principal this Friday. While the desert trip is something he has wanted to do for quite a while, it will take his mind off the beginning of term three and the fact that it won't find him teaching. "I've thoroughly enjoyed myself here, that's made it hard to make the retirement decision." "I'm lucky I've been enjoying where I am and what I'm doing - it's a good school, good staff, and a great community to work with. I have no doubts I'm going to miss it, and particular the Kids, who I've enjoyed working with," he said.

Mr Gotch began as a principal at Tailem Bend in 1976 and has been though many experiences at the school, including the establishment of the administration block, the opening of the library to the community, changes to student enrolment numbers and 1984, and the loss of six classrooms to fire. *"That was a pretty traumatic experience for all those involved, but the positive side of it was the community support. The whole community really came together and held a fire appeal." "I think that situation was an indication of community concern for the school; their involvement and interest has continued,"* he said.

Mr Gotch said further proof of this support, has been seen in the community's fundraising efforts for a gymnasium -- \$120,000 has been raised in two and a half years. On Thursday Mr Gotch will meet with the State Loans Advisory Council for approval for financing of the gym, which he said would be the culmination of a *"bit of a dream." "If you've got to go out, it's nice to go out on a good note. I hope to still be involved in fund-raising and remain on the committee if the new principal agrees 'Mike Innes, of Mannum Primary School' will take over as acting principal from Mr Gotch, who will remain living in Murray Bridge."*

I've always been a community person and I can see myself driving for Meals On Wheels and things like that in the future. But first I want to relax and do a few things of my own!"

Tailem Gym Opened

Tailem Bend's school and community gymnasium is now officially open. In a ceremony at the school on Friday, former principal Neville Gotch, Gymnasium committee chairman Mike Kozikowski, and student representative Alisha Mclouglin cut a ribbon to mark the occasion.

More than 200 community and school committee members attended the event, including six past principals, and present- Monica Williams, Noel Kneebone, Joan Fabbian, Neville Gotch John Hackett, and Mike Innes, Also there were District superintendent of education Trevor Radtoff, Peter Roberts representing the Department of Education Training and Employment, Member for Hammond Peter lewis, and Barry Featherston, representing the Department of Recreation and Sport. Former principal Neville Gotch said the gymnasium showed that dreams do come true. It was a dream when talked about in 1991-1992 and in 1993 a public meeting was called and a steering committee formed. A target of \$120.000 in almost unpreceded effort of community enthusiasm and dedication this money was raised. "It was a tremendous effort" he said.

The gymnasium was testament to the community of Tailem Bend and something of which they could be really proud. Mr Gotch said the facility was already being well used but there was scope for much greater use – from kinder gym to seniors' citizens' indoor bowling and everything in between. Gymnasium committee chairman since its inception Mike Kozikowski said the multi- function facility was a *"magnificent stadium for our kids and our community to enjoy."* He said that by the time the committee was required to pay the bill, the committee had raised about \$140.000. The gymnasium was a *"magnificent testament"* to the Tailem Bend community. Speakers also included Dylan Hogarth = Sweetman and Alisha Mcloughlin, representing the student representative council.

MMCPN Under-65 Funding Tender

The Department of Human Services (DHS), under-65 funding tender, rebranded as Community Transport SA (CTSA), opened in October 2024 and closed in January 2025. Successful supplier(s) will be notified in April 2025, with new CTSA agreements commencing on 1 September 2025. This timeline ensures a smooth transition period for uninterrupted service delivery.

TBCC Murray Mallee Community Passenger Network (MMCPN) has tendered for CTSA funding. If successful, this will significantly expand TBCC's service footprint, enabling us to continue to deliver integrated transport services across both under-65 and over-65 age groups offering a seamless and efficient experience for all consumers. TBCC strongly advocates for a unified approach, as it ensures service viability and minimizes confusion for consumers. The MMCPN over 65 years transport is funded by the Department of Health and Aged Care (DOHAC) through the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP).

In the event the CTSA tender is unsuccessful, TBCC will continue to provide transport services for over-65 consumers under the current federal contract until it concludes in June 2027, with a possibility of renewed funding. Regardless of the outcome, TBCC remains committed to advocating for and delivering a best-practice transport model that prioritises the needs of the community.

Australian Service Excellence Accreditation (ASES)

Standards Assurance assessors will be visiting the TBCC Tuesday 18 and Wednesday 19 March 2025, for our 3-year Australian Service Excellence Accreditation (ASES) review. TBCC is proud to have achieved ASES Certificate Level in 2012 and upgraded to Award Level in 2022, placing us among just six providers nationwide to reach this prestigious level of excellence. This review highlights our ongoing commitment to best practice service, ensuring we continue to meet the needs of the communities we serve.

Station Master's House

One of the treasures of our community is the historic Station Master's House, a landmark that encapsulates Tailem Bend's rich heritage. Its story begins with the opening of the Intercolonial Railway on 1 May 1886, connecting Adelaide to the Victorian border and sparking the birth of Tailem Bend. Over the years, this vital junction shaped our township's rail and agricultural legacy.

Constructed in 1916 by Mr. William Dick under the architectural guidance of Mr. Alfred Bonython, the Station Master's House stands as a testament to dedication and resilience, exemplified by Stationmaster Mr. Ambrose Sieben. Today, it continues to highlight our railway heritage and the enduring spirit of our community.

On Friday, 31 January 2025, TBCC proudly celebrated the opening of a sustainability garden to promote food security at the Station Master's House, officiated by the Hon. Minister for Human Services and Aged Care, Nat Cook. A centrepiece of the event was the unveiling of an extraordinary art installation—an animated talking tree named Pinar (pronounced Peanar), which means "Tree" in Ngarrindjeri. Pinar shares captivating stories, wisdom, and insights about our community and the stunning Murray River, Lakes, and Coorong region. With regularly updated recordings, Pinar promises to encourage repeat visits and greater community engagement with the garden and the centre.

Since taking ownership on 31 October 2024, TBCC has envisioned transforming the Station Master's House into a dynamic hub of community engagement and economic growth. Plans include a social enterprise retail space and training facility. This multifaceted destination will serve as a unique attraction for locals and visitors alike, fostering connection, creativity, and opportunity. Importantly, TBCC will retain its current building, expanding its footprint to accommodate growing needs and ensure the community continues to be well-supported.

We extend heartfelt gratitude to the local tradespeople who have generously contributed their time, skills, and expertise to achieve Stage One improvements. Their invaluable support has brought this vision closer to reality. Looking ahead, further development will rely on securing additional grant funding, and we are committed to pursuing every opportunity to make this dream a reality.

Local Initiatives Share in Vena Energy Community Sponsorship

In the broader Coorong District, the Coonalpyn Golf Club received a new BBQ to help enrich community gatherings, enhance social events, support fundraisers, and add value to local golf events.

Murray Bridge Pre-school Kindergarten received support

to create an outdoor learning space for 50 children, featuring Ngarrindjeri cultural elements, sensory areas and bush tucker gardens.

"This outdoor space will provide our children with meaningful connections to the environment, Ngarrindjeri culture and learning, and an understanding of sustainability and Caring for Country. It will also be a quiet space to support children's developmental needs," said Shirley Hartman, Director of Murray Bridge Pre-school Kindergarten.

Owen Sela, Head of Australia at Vena Energy, said the Coorong District Community Sponsorship Program aimed to deliver wide-ranging benefits while building stronger connections within Vena Energy's host communities.





Eagles Welcome Tyson Edwards

The Tailem Bend Football Club, a cornerstone of the River Murray Football League since its inception in 1946, has witnessed many ups and downs over the decades. Today, the club is on the verge of something colossal, and excitement is building with the appointment of the club's new head coach, Tyson Edwards.

For the Tailem Bend Eagles faithful, the arrival of Edwards represents not just the start of a new season, but the dawn of a new era. Tyson, a former AFL legend with 321 games under his belt, has always had a deep connection to the Murraylands, born in the Karoonda Hospital in 1976, Edwards grew up on his families Wynarka share farm with the Mallee and football in his blood.

As a teenager, his commitment was evident. Between the ages of 11 and 15, his mother, Jan, would drive him on a 250km round trip from Wynarka to Adelaide a couple of times a week, to ensure he could train with West Adelaide's junior squads. That dedication paid off when Tyson was recruited by the SANFL, eventually debuting for the Adelaide Crows in 1995.

Over the next 15 years, Edwards became a fan favourite at the Crows. Known for his reliability, composure under pressure, and versatility on the field, he played a key role in two premiership-winning teams. In 2009, he celebrated his 300th AFL game, a testament to his durability and consistent performance. Just four games later, he and close friend Andrew McLeod set a new VFL/AFL record for the most games played together as teammates.

Though Tyson retired from the AFL in 2010, his passion for the sport has never waned. He transitioned into coaching, spending several years as an assistant coach at Port Adelaide Football Club. Tailem Bend, however, offers something different-a return to his roots, a chance to build something special from the ground up.

"I have always been interested in returning to grassroots" coaching at some stage - when the time was right - and now seems to be the right time," Tyson said. "Coaching my youngest son Brodie, also helped with my decision, along with my brother, and his family's long-term association with the club. Football clubs are built on community, and that's something I understand deeply," Tyson says. "We have a unique opportunity here at Tailem Bend to not just compete but to create something lasting. The club's history is rich, and I want to add to that."

It's not just about the senior team for Edwards, he's already shown a keen interest in helping develop Tailem Bend's junior players, recognizing that the future of the club relies on nurturing young talent. "The juniors are a huge part of our plans," Edwards emphasizes. "We've already identified some players who are close to being ready for senior football. My goal is to make the transition from junior football to senior football, as seamless as possible, by playing a consistent style throughout the club."

"My experiences at AFL level have given me some fantastic tools to help teach and grow each player I work with. Anyone wanting to improve their game, will be given the help and the platform to be able to do that." Tyson explains.

"The challenge of building the club back to a very competitive organisation is something I am really looking forward to, and I think that can be a lot of fun and can happen quite quickly."

"Our supporters will enjoy watching the style of football we'll be playing, and we will be hard to play against."

Many plants at Pangarinda Botanic Garden are beginning to show stress from lack of rain.

It is little wonder when rain tallied at the end of 2024 was only 233ml for 12 months, with January the only month receiving a heavy downpour. This is the lowest rainfall measured since we started the Garden in 1993. Over the past 31 years Pangarinda has averaged around 350ml. With no sub moisture volunteers are finding it hard to keep water up to last year's planting as roots haven't been able to establish. Flowering did surprise me during the winter and early spring, how well some flowered as if the dry suited them. Very poor flowering at present.

Visitors still find beauty in the variation in leaf colours and plant forms. With most Bird Lovers pleased with the birds to be seen. The Rainbow Bird is one bird on Bird lovers lists to sight at Pangarinda. Another is the Blue Bonnet Parrot.

Rainbow Birds appeared at their usual time of arrival, first






